This is the Amazon River boto, a pink dolphin that only lives in the Amazon basin. It is one of five endangered species of river dolphin in the world. The Ganges river dolphin that lives in India and Nepal is also experiencing survival difficulties. Sadly, in China the Yangtze river dolphin was recently declared to be extinct, as they have not been seen for some years.

River dolphins are naturally limited to the river systems in which they were born, imprisoned by salt-water oceans. This is largely because they have evolved with this quality and type of water. Secondly, their diet varies little and their prey species are usually endemic to that river system.

Dolphins cannot live in sewerage or chemically contaminated rivers but need flowing water of the correct acidity or alkalinity.

Therefore pollution is a great danger for these mammals. Moreover, the fish they eat must also be clean and chemical free.

Otherwise the toxic flesh of their prey builds up in their bodies over the years as it does in all predators. When this happens it is a difficult and long term problem to overcome.

Therefore we need to ensure that these river systems are kept clean, and that overfishing by local communities do not reduce the available prey for these fantastic creatures. FES has been to the River Amazon and has helped a local community work with the boto. We have also been to Nepal and will be working with our Nepalese partners to help keep these rivers clean and in good condition.

River dolphins are not as well known as ocean dolphins. So to help their cause, FES are raising awareness of their difficulties throughout all of the medias. So to help their cause, FES is raising awareness of the freshwater species.
